2. Logical Equivalence, Tautologies and Contradictions

In logic, a tautology (from the Greek word *ταυτολογία*) is a formula or assertion that is true in every possible interpretation. A simple example is "(x equals y) or (x does not equal y)" (or as a less abstract example, "The ball is green or the ball is not green").
